Important change: any items received by the Uniform Shop not listed on an agreement will be donated to the student emergency loan items.

General Rules

Students are to familiarise themselves with all expectations in regards to the wearing of the School Uniform and the various rules governing presentation, grooming, the wearing of non-school items and unacceptable accessorising.

A range of consequences is in place for students who are in breach of the School Uniform Code.

All students are required to wear the School uniform which is purchased from the School Uniform Shop.

The uniform is to be worn with pride and respect ensuring all items are in a state of good repair and fit well.

The uniform is to be worn from the time a student leaves home until the student returns home.

Summer and winter uniform is not to be mixed.

Year 12 students are to wear the Year 12 Senior jumper within the guidelines set by the Principal.

Students not correctly presented will be sent to the Student Services Office. Students may be required to undertake lessons in the Focus Room if correct uniform item cannot be delivered to the School. Parents will be contacted.

Non school items will be confiscated for the remainder of the Term.

A range of consequences are in place for non-compliance.

During Terms 1 & 4, boys and girls are required to wear the formal summer uniform with regulation school shoes. A school issue hat must also be worn on each occasion a student is outdoors during the course of the school day.

During Terms 2 and 3 boys and girls are required to wear the formal winter uniform with regulation school shoes. The formal jumper is not part of the winter PE uniform but it may be worn to and from school for additional warmth. It must be removed once the student has arrived at school. Failure to do so may result in the jumper being confiscated.

The PE uniform is to be worn only on a day when a PE lesson is scheduled. The PE jacket may be worn if required. The formal jumper is not to be worn with the PE uniform at any time.

The blazer is to be worn on special occasions and on excursions.



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Rules For Girls

Hair ties are to be in school colours (bottle green, gold or red) or a colour which blends in with the natural colour range of hair.

The wearing of hair adornments, novelty clips and accessories is not permitted. Items may be confiscated.

Hair should be neat and tidy. Coloured or streaked hair must be of a natural shade. Extreme hair styles and colouring is not permitted. Parents will be contacted to have the matter corrected immediately.

Long hair and fringes must be securely tied back off the face during manual arts subjects.

Girls must have a natural look. Make up removal attracts a \$5 fine.

Girls are not permitted to wear nail polish. Nail polish removal attracts a \$5 fine.

Jewellery is limited to a wrist watch, a small cross or purity ring which is to be worn on a thin chain around the neck under the uniform, and a maximum of only one plain gold or silver sleeper or small stud in each ear lobe. No other form of exposed body piercing (covered/uncovered) is acceptable.

Acrylic and false nails are discouraged due to the practical nature of some subjects. However, any girl wearing artificial nails is to ensure they are natural in colour and filed short.

Parents are advised via SMS when a fine is issues to their student.

Rules For Boys

Boys are to be clean shaven. Boys who attend school unshaven will be sent to the Student Services Office to shave. The consequence for this is a \$5 fine.

Hair is to be above the collar, is not to be hanging over the eyes and does not feature plaits or dreadlocks.

Whilst boys may wear their hair tied back, it still must not exceed the prescribed length as featured above.

For OH&S reasons boys may be required to tie their hair back in manual arts, kitchens and PE subjects, whilst working in laboratories or in any other situation in which long hair may pose a risk.

Undercuts must not be shorter than a number 2 and shaving styles or lines into the hair is not permitted.

Inappropriate spiking, colouring, or unkempt, bushy, thick hair is not permitted.

Jewellery is limited to a wrist watch and a small cross on a thin chain which may be worn around the neck under the school uniform.

Boys are not permitted to wear earrings, piercings and other jewellery. No form of exposed body piercing (covered/uncovered) is acceptable.

Parents are advised via SMS when a fine is issues to their student.

Sports Uniform (Girls & Boys)

The sports uniform is compulsory for all students in Years 7 to 9 and students undertaking PE as a subject in Years 10 to 12.

In Terms 1 and 4 the school hat is compulsory for all outdoor activities during school hours.

Tattoos

In South Australia it is against the law for a person under the age of 18 to get a tattoo. Tattoos are prohibited at Temple Christian College. Students who are 18 years of age are not permitted to get a tattoo whilst attending Temple Christian College. The Principal will be advised immediately. Students must realise their enrolment at the school may be withdrawn for a breach of this matter.

Formal Summer Uniform

Girls

School summer monogrammed dress the length of which is to cover the knee
School formal jumper
School white ankle or knee high socks
School vest (optional)
Regulation, black lace-up school shoes with suitable heel and tread

Boys

School short-sleeved monogrammed shirt
Grey, melange school shorts
School formal jumper
School grey socks with green stripe
School vest (optional)
Regulation, black school shoe

The School vest is optional for boys and girls and can be worn in summer and winter.

Presentation Night

Presentation Night is the most formal evening in the School Calendar. The School expects students to attend looking their very best.

Girls are to wear their Formal Summer Uniform with long white socks and blazer and must have a 'natural' look. Hair colouring or streaks must be within the natural colour range of the girls hair. Hair style must be a conventional, tidy style. Only hair ties in school colours may be worn to tie the hair back. Hair adornments (flowers, etc) must not be worn.

Boys are to wear their Formal Winter Uniform with their blazer. Boys are to be clean shaven and hair is to be compliant with School regulations. A wrist watch is the only jewellery that may be worn by boys.

Formal Winter Uniform

Girls

School winter tartan skirt the length of which is to cover the knee
School blouse top button to be worn done up
School tie
School formal jumper
School Blazer
School beige socks or School bottle green 70 denier stockings
School vest (optional)
Regulation, black lace-up shoe with suitable heel and tread

Boys

School long-sleeved, monogrammed shirt
School grey melange trousers worn with black suit-type belt with small buckle
School tie
School formal jumper
School grey socks with green stripe
School vest (optional)
Regulation, black lace-up shoes with suitable heel and tread

The School vest is optional for boys and girls and can be worn in summer and winter.

The girls winter blouse and boys winter shirt must be worn with the top button done up and the tie in place.

The blazer is a compulsory Winter Uniform item during Terms 2 and 3 and must be worn to and from school.

The blazer must be worn for Assembly when the Winter Uniform is worn.

Examinations

Examinations are a formal School event held at Years 8 to 12. Formal Winter Uniform including the blazer must be worn for examinations held at the end of Semester 1.

Year 12 Students are not permitted to wear their Seniors Jumper. Formal Summer Uniform must be worn for Term 4 examinations.

Students are to be well presented and well groomed and are to be compliant with all School expectations. Students who are not compliant may find they are unable to sit the examination .



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Sports Uniform

Girls & Boys

- School sports hat
- School short sleeved polo top
- School jacket
- School shorts
- School track-pants
- School white sports sock
- Compliant sturdy lace-up sports shoes (cross trainer type)

Unless otherwise advised, PE Uniform may only be worn on a day when a PE lesson is scheduled. It is not to be worn in place of the Formal Uniform. The exception to this is students that have training for weekly sport at LINCHTIME of a non-PE day may wear their PE uniform to school.

Students that have training for weekly sport AFTER SCHOOL are NOT permitted to wear their PE uniform to school that day, unless they have PE scheduled as a lesson.

The PE Uniform is compulsory for all students in Year 7 to 9 and all students in Years 10 to 12 undertaking sports as a subject or engaged as part of a sports team.

In cold weather, the formal jumper may be worn with the sports jacket for additional warmth, but the formal jumper must be removed if the jacket is removed.

Various sports team tops, shorts and spikes are supplied as a hire item. Students must not swap or loan these items to others. Charges apply for non-returns or damage.

Inter House Sports Events

Inter-House Swimming Carnival

The Inter-House Swimming Carnival is an all-day event. All students are expected to attend. Students wear summer casual clothing reflecting their House colours.

Boys may wear board-shorts or compression shorts for swimming.

Girls are to wear a modest, one-piece outfit for swimming. A non-transparent top is to be worn over a two piece if that is the only bathers owned by the student.

Students must bring a water bottle, sun screen and a towel, goggles and swimming cap (if owned by a student).

Students whose swimming outfit is deemed too revealing will be required to remain in their casual clothing or borrow a sports uniform.

Inter-House Athletics

The Inter-House Athletics Carnival is an all-day event. All students are expected to attend.

Students wear suitable t-shirt and shorts in their team colours.

A compliant sports shoe is required especially for those wishing to compete.

Inter-House Cross Country

The Inter-House Cross Country is a half-day event. Normal lessons are conducted up until lunchtime. All students are expected to attend.

Students wear their sports uniform to school. If senior students do not own a school sports uniform they may change into the appropriate running attire at lunchtime on the day of the carnival.

At lunchtime students may change into a t-shirt reflecting their team colours.

A complaint sports shoe is required to be worn by all students.



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Miscellaneous Items

The School backpack is compulsory for all students in Years 7 to 12. A trolley bag is available if required.

Students are not permitted to bring a non-school bag or handbag to school.

Winter woollen accessories must be Bottle green and match the formal jumper or blazer.

Students choosing to wear wet-weather jackets must wear a bottle green jacket.

Subject specific items such as Food and Hospitality Uniforms are available for purchase from the Campus Uniform Shop.

Competition swimwear is to be a modest one-piece design for girls and appropriate race bathers for boys.

The commemorative Year 12 jumper is to be worn in accordance with Principal's directions.

Special Events & Excursions

Formal Uniform with blazer is worn on School excursions and special events.

Students representing the School in sports events must wear correct PE Uniform.

The School hat is required for all off campus excursions and events in Terms 1 and 4.

Parents will be advised in writing if casual clothes are required for an excursion.

Casual Clothes

Neat casual dress is required.

Closed in shoes are required if manual arts or sports lessons are timetabled

Jewellery is to be kept within the bounds of school rules. Makeup is to be 'natural' looking

School Uniform will be loaned to students to change into if:

- Clothing displays ugly prints, inappropriate words or slogans
- Clothing is sheer or see-through
- Midriff is bare
- Underwear is visible
- Low cut, revealing necklines or sleeveless tops are worn.
- 'Short' shorts or short skirts are worn
- Leggings are not covered by an over-skirt or a long top
- Clothing is stained, cut or has holes in it

Casual days are held to raise funds for the School Mission Possible projects.

Students must bring a \$2 donation on the day in order to participate.

Students not participating must wear their school uniform on the day.

Students will be advised of Casual Days via the Student Notices prior to the event.
